

The University of Kansas and Hutchinson Community College Nursing Partnership

The Nursing Partnership combines the convenience of being a nursing student at HCC and pursuing both the Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) and Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN). This curriculum makes it possible for a student to complete the ADN and BSN through on-campus courses at HCC and online courses through KU. After completing the program, eligible students are awarded both HCC's ADN and KU's BSN.

The nursing partnership model is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission, the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN), and the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE).

Students enter the Hutchinson and KU nursing programs in the fall semester. A student cannot progress in the KU Partnership if they do not progress in the HCC Program. Clinicals are included in the HCC curriculum.

KU classes will be taken during fall, spring, and summer semesters. Students are required to take a minimum of six (6) credit hours within the KU nursing curriculum each semester in addition to the semester coursework for HCC.

Graduate with your ADN & BSN at the same time.

Eligibility & Requirements

To be considered a qualified applicant to HCC's RN program, an applicant must:

1. Make an application between September 1 – January 30.
2. Have a minimum 2.75 GPA in completed general education courses completed by the application deadline that are required for the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing.
3. General Education Courses:
 - BI103 Human Anatomy & Physiology (6 credits) Meet pre-requisite of BI100 Basic Concepts for Allied Health or BI101 General Biology
 - PS100 General Psychology
 - EN 101 English Composition IA or EN100 English Composition 1B

 - SH101 Public Speaking

- BI112 General Microbiology
 - HE202/SO100 Nutrition or Sociology
4. Have a minimum 2.00 cumulative college GPA
 5. Kaplan entrance exam scores
 6. The HCC RN program admits 40 students who begin the program in Fall Semester.

To qualify for admission to the KU School of Nursing Partnership Program, a student must first be admitted to HCC's ADN program for the fall semester

Eligible students then apply to KU Nursing for that upcoming fall semester. (The student must begin the ADN and BSN nursing curriculum during the same fall semester HCC's ADN program begins.)

All 60 credit hours of the following prerequisite courses must be completed prior to beginning the program. No exceptions will be made for applicants with incomplete prerequisite courses. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 is required. (KU nursing advisor will calculate grade point average using KU policies).

The KU Nursing Curriculum: 30 credit hours

Students in the Partnership are required to enroll in at least six credit hours of KU nursing courses each semester (Fall, Spring, Summer, Fall, Spring) through the KUMC campus, in addition to their HCC ADN courses. The KU nursing classes are all online and accessible 24 hours a day. The KU curriculum includes ten courses: Introduction to the Baccalaureate Nurse Role; Using Technology & Informatics to Enhance Client Safety; Nursing in Healthcare Microsystems; Teamwork & Collaboration in Healthcare; Population Health; Organizational Influences on Nursing Practice; Improving Health Care Quality; Evidence-Based Nursing Practice; Influences of the Healthcare Macrosystem on Nursing Practice; Senior Project

Tuition and Fees

Students in this program will pay HCC tuition and fees for courses enrolled through the community college and KU Medical Center/Nursing tuition & fees for courses enrolled through the KU's School of Nursing. Students are eligible to apply for federal financial aid through FAFSA. KU ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: You must be admitted to the Hutchinson Community College ADN program for the semester in which you are applying for admission to the KU School of Nursing. **You must begin the ADN and BSN nursing programs during the same semester.**

Other KU requirements include a minimum cumulative GPA of at least 2.50, completion of all of the prerequisite courses detailed below, three letters of reference, a professional resume, and the online application. Admission is competitive; applicants are not guaranteed admission.

When calculating GPA, all non-vocational and non-remedial courses from all colleges and universities attended are considered. With the exception of Intermediate Algebra, remedial courses are not factored into the GPA. When a course is repeated, both the original and the new grade are factored into the GPA. With the exception of A.D.N. courses, courses that do not transfer to KU are not factored into the GPA.

KU APPLICATION DEADLINE: Immediately upon notification of admission to the Hutchinson Community College A.D.N. program, students should apply to the KU School of Nursing. All application materials, including transcripts and references, **MUST** be received by **July 1st**. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

LIBERAL ARTS REQUIREMENTS: The BSN consists of 120 credit hours, 60 of which are primarily liberal arts and sciences courses. The remaining 60 credits required make up the nursing major. Credit for the nursing major courses is earned through a combination of portfolio examination of ADN course work and KU BSN course work. The course list below details the 60 credit hours of liberal arts courses required prior to matriculation into the Partnership program.

Courses with grades of "D" or "F" will not be counted towards the required 60 hours. No Pass/Fail courses will be accepted.
